But if you take a <u>closer</u> look, you can enjoy <u>how it expresses</u> foggy London and the <u>delicate reflection</u> on the <u>water</u>. Of course, we don't <u>have enough</u> time and energy to do this <u>with</u> every single painting, but we don't have to. <u>When you go to a buffet</u>, you will not take all the <u>dishes</u>. Instead, you look <u>through them</u> and only <u>pick out ones</u> you like. Similarly, we don't have to enjoy all the paintings in a museum. When you find a <u>favorite piece of work</u> in a museum, you may start wondering what the right answer is. For example, "Woman Reading a Letter" by Johannes Vermeer <u>will raise</u> many questions. Is she <u>pregnant</u>? Why is she standing <u>while</u> reading a letter? <u>What is written in it</u>? How does she <u>feel</u>? The painter <u>might have</u> <u>had the answers, but getting the right answers is not that important. What is</u> <u>important is to carefully observe the painting and flexibly</u> imagine the situation. If <u>you assume that</u> she is pregnant, what could be <u>written in the</u> letter? Is there any <u>clue to her feelings? Who wrote the letter? You can feel free to make a story based</u> <u>on what you have found. Again, it doesn't matter whether</u> your story is right or <u>wrong. The process of observing</u> and imagining is <u>both</u> enjoyable and <u>helpful</u>.
